IV. Spotlight on MCR visit to RE Olds Museum

Some of the club members went to Lansing for the joint meeting with the R.E. Olds Chapter. The Motor City Rockets met at the Meijer's on 8 Mile Road in Livonia. Taking the scenic route, we traveled on Grand River all the way to Lansing. We had a lot of fun with a Road Rally reading the clues and trying to figure out the answers. First prize for the most correct answers went to the Australian family that is here on work assignment in the States. Second prize went to Dave and Denise Tucker. Third prize was won by Tom and Kristy Walker. It was a nice sunny day for a cruise.

The museum was very nice. I think the R.E. Olds chapter had us beat as far as number of members who showed up. I believe the final joint tally was 78. The Lansing chapter went all out and cooked steaks for everyone! Unfortunately, many of the displays had been moved out at the last minute in preparation for a General Motors event highlighting the end of the Olds nameplate. We had a good time anyway, and many of the R.E. Olds displays were still intact, as well as some interesting period displays of household items and clothing. And Helen Earley and Jim Walkinshaw gave a wonderful talk about Oldsmobile and the books that they have written about Oldsmobile, as well as what started them collecting what is now valuable memorabilia. They stayed to autograph copies of their books for the club members, too.

V. Spotlight on the Last Olds to Roll Off the Line in Lansing

On Thursday, April 29, three OCA and Motor City Rocket members, Steve Apking, Jerry Garfield and Bill Szelag were present at the Lansing assembly plant when the last Oldsmobile was built. The event was a very sad day for all Oldsmobile enthusiasts and especially for these three as all three started their careers as Oldsmobile Service Department employees. The final Olds Alero came off the line at 10:00 AM with approximately 600 total people attending, mostly GM employees, but also included the press, Oldsmobile dealers and local Lansing officials. Amy Farmer, current plant manager spoke at the press conference as well as Darwin Clark, former General Manager of Oldsmobile and UAW officials. After the press conference at the plant there was a lunch for dignitaries, Olds enthusiasts and former Oldsmobile employees at the Oldsmobile History Museum in downtown Lansing. Many R.E Olds Chapter members were also at the luncheon as the R. E. Olds Chapter president, Judy Badgley, arranged a fabulous display of approximately 25 R.E. Olds member's Oldsmobiles! GM also placed many beautiful Oldsmobiles from the GM collection in the museum and an "Open House" was held for the rest of the afternoon at the museum.

Although it was a very well done event, it ironically paralleled a funeral service, since at the plant we viewed the last Oldsmobile followed by the speakers giving their "eulogy" describing the past accomplishments of Oldsmobile (notice the flowers). The speakers also emotionally described the effects the Oldsmobile nameplate has had on the many people who built, designed, sold, bought, and most importantly, drove the fallen brand. The tearful "eulogy" also described how the Oldsmobile name impacted the city of Lansing, Michigan, its original

birth place and home. The gathering of friends and family at the plant and the museum during the luncheon and open house shared memories, special moments together just as is the custom at a memorial service. As is often the case, the "memorial" event was just as much a celebration of the life of Oldsmobile as it was its passing. The "people, passion and performance of Oldsmobile" as described by Darwin Clark will certainly live on even though the final Oldsmobile will soon be at its final resting place at the Oldsmobile Heritage Center. The friends and family of Oldsmobile, be it employee, Lansing resident, assembly worker, or OCA member will certainly not allow this old friend to ever be forgotten.

LAST OLDS ROLLS OFF LINE IN LANSING . . . The final Oldsmobile rolled off the line yesterday at 10 a.m. at the Lansing Car Assembly plant, marking the end of the brand's 107-year history. The vehicle was the 500th of the "Final 500 Special Edition" Alero cars. It is Metallic Cherry Red and bears signatures of the 4,500 workers at the Lansing plant under the hood and trunk. Presenters at the end-of-line ceremony included Amy Farmer, plant manager, UAW Local 602 and UAW 652 officials, and former Oldsmobile General Manager Darwin Clark, who retires June 1 as GM vice president, industry-dealer affairs. Following the ceremony, the Final 500 Alero was driven by Doug Stott, Oldsmobile product manager, to the R.E. Olds Transportation Museum in Lansing where it will join other Final 500 models and significant older Oldsmobile models for a few months before moving to the GM Heritage Museum.

A total of 35,229,218 Oldsmobiles were built since 1897; of those, 14,458,756 were built in Lansing. The Alero was the last car Oldsmobile made. Production of the Bravada and Silhouette ended earlier this year. Aurora production ended last year and Intrigue production ceased in May 2002. GM made the decision to retire the Oldsmobile brand in December of 2000. It was the oldest automotive brand in the U.S.

DID YOU KNOW? . . . Ransom E. Olds started the Olds Motor Vehicle Co. in Lansing in 1897, with GM acquiring the company in 1908. Oldsmobile pioneered chrome-plated trim and gave drivers the Eighty-Eight series, the front-wheel-drive Toronado and the Cutlass. It even inspired songs, including "In My Merry Oldsmobile" and "Rocket 88."
